Renmark Paringa Council are proud to announce the recipients of the prestigious Australia Day Citizen of the Year Awards for 2024.

These awards acknowledge individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the Renmark Paringa community and who embody the spirit of Australia Day.

The recipients of the 2024 Australian Day Citizen of the Year Awards are:

Citizen of the Year – Alan Coulter

Alan and his wife Lois moved to Renmark in 1976 and since then he has dedicated his life to helping others through rehabilitation, injury prevention, fitness, coaching, teaching, and mentoring.

Alan has made a significant difference in the lives of others through his working career in rehabilitation. He has helped many people recover from physical injury arising from sport, vehicle accidents, falls, joint fatigue, and those suffering from medical conditions. Many people in the community have benefited from his knowledge, heartfelt application, and tireless care over many decades.

Throughout his time in Renmark, he has spent a tremendous amount of time working with sporting groups to improve their fitness and reduce the risk of injury. He has worked closely with the Renmark Rovers Football Club freely over 45 years and has been a pivotal factor in their improved fitness and work ethic. Along with the Renmark Rovers, Alan has also worked closely with the Renmark Netball Club, Renmark Rowing Club, Renmark Swimming Club, and various local schools.

Alan was also instrumental in the development of the Renmark Recreation Centre which was renamed in his honour to the Alan Coulter Recreation Centre. His involvement meant people could attend the centre to improve their fitness in a safe environment and attend rehabilitation centres in a heated pool. His standard of care has always been exemplary, and he displays a deep level of care to all those he helps.

Community Event of the Year – Renmark's Christmas Pageant

Award for Active Citizenship - Ann Ryan

Ann is a dedicated volunteer who is well known for her contributions at the National Trust Olivewood Historic Homestead and Museum as well as Cammies Antiques in Paringa and the Renmark Hotel Museum.

Earlier in her life, Ann also volunteered her time to go to the Hermannsburg Missionary in the Northern Territory and the Buddhist Orphanage in Sri Lanka.

Ann has also volunteered her time helping many other community organisations including the Chaffey Community Centre and she is a current member of the Bookmark Creek Action Group.

Along with volunteering, Ann has fundraised and donated to community organisations and projects to improve and enhance the quality of life of residents in our community. These include the Renmark Palliative Care Unit, Dementia Research, Renmark Hotel Museum and Olivewood Historic Homestead and Museum.

Ann's dedication to volunteering and helping others less fortunate is a sign of her caring nature. Her passion for preserving and showcasing our local history is something that will benefit our community for many generations to come.

Award for Active Citizenship - Grant Schwartzkopff

Grant has been a dedicated community photographer for many years taking photos at various sporting and local community events. This involves him attending many sporting competitions and events almost every weekend of the year, which he always does with a smile on his face.
